



## How do you stay active in St. Francis?

St. Francis has 15 miles of trails and we're building more every year. So hike along the river, go for a run, bike to school, stroll through a park while the kids play, and walk to dinner - whatever it takes to keep moving.

- 1 Community Trail Loop** 1 mile

A flat, paved one mile loop through Community Park. Walk to school at St. Francis Elementary or Trinity Lutheran. A connecting trail along Rum River Blvd will bring you to Woodbury Park and the Rum River.
- 2 Dellwood Trail Loop** 1 mile

A one mile loop of paved trail in and around Dellwood River Park. Enjoy views of the Rum River, prairie, wetlands, and forest.
- 3 Hidden Ponds Trail Loop** .4 miles

Just under half a mile paved walking loop at Hidden Ponds Park. Take a stroll while others are playing soccer, softball, or using the playground.
- 4 Rum River North County Park Trail Loop** 2 miles

A two mile loop in the county park with access to even more park trails. Walk next to the Rum River, up and down through forests, and into downtown St. Francis.
- 5 Deer Creek Trail Loop** 1 mile

An active living loop that connects neighborhoods, a shopping area for your everyday errands, and Deer Creek 2nd Park
